Suffolk Regiment 4th Battalion
formerly of the R.A.S.C

George Haddock was the 24 year old son of Aylburton collier William Haddock, and his wife Caroline Collins, who were married in 1886. The couple had six children, all born at Aylburton.

The 1911 census records George at home in Albert Street, Lydney, helping his mother and sisters operate a small brewery, but his father and eldest brother, William, had moved to the Rhondda Valley in South Wales, looking for work. The family had settled at Blaenrhondda, Treherbert, in Glamorganshire, when George enlisted in the R.A.S.C. at Pentre.

He was serving with the Suffolk Regiment when he died from his wounds on May 30th, 1917, and is buried at Sunken Road Cemetery, Boisleux, St. Mark.
