Harry Robins 1892–1916 Private 4274 13th Division Cycling Corps

Harry Robins was the 24 year old son of blacksmith's labourer, Henry Colwell Robins (1854-1903), and his wife Edith Mary Addis (1861-1919).

He was working as a colliery engine driver when he enlisted with 7th (Service) Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment, at Lydney in August 1914.

He transferred to the 13th Division Cycling Corps on January 11th 1915 and was part of the 13th Division Signals Corps attached to the Mediterranean Expeditionary Force, when he arrived at Basra, Iraq, in February 1916.

Harry was killed in action on April 23rd 1916. He is commemorated on the Basra Memorial.
