William Powell baptised at Aylburton in 1882, he was the eldest son of railway plate-layer, James Powell, and his wife, Mary Ann Haddock, who were married at Lydney earlier that year and lived on Aylburton Common.

William enlisted in the Worcestershires on 17th November 1915 and was killed in action a year later, November 14th 1916.

He is buried at Ancre British Cemetery, Beaumont-Hamel.
